What specifically is it about our wondrous experience with Christ that we urgently need to share with other people in our neighborhood and city?

This is the question put before us by Thomas Bandy in his book <u>Worship Ways</u>. To guide people through their answer to this question, Bandy puts before us seven different understandings of how churches present their experiences of Christ, noting how churches tend to emphasize one or two of them in worship and outreach over and over again:

- Christ as Promise Keeper, blessing people with inspiration and hope for tomorrow
- Christ as Higher Power, blessing people with transformation and a fresh start
- Christ as Spiritual Guide, blessing people to cope with daily struggles and navigate life's ambiguities
- Christ as Teacher, blessing people with insight into eternal truths and authentic relationships
- Christ as Healer, blessing people with physical, emotional, relational, and spiritual wholeness and health
- Christ as Vindicator, blessing people with justice and raising their self-esteem
- Christ as Shepherd, blessing people with acceptance, belonging, and companionship

Which of the experiences listed above is most essential to you? What of your experience with Christ would you want others to know?

On Sunday, June 27th, we will gather as a congregation for the first of several gatherings to start our work in preparing for our time of transition towards new pastoral staff.

This gathering will begin in the sanctuary at our regular time of 10:30 for a shortened worship service of prayer and music and a short sermon to prepare ourselves for the work ahead of us. Following the service, we will form smaller groups of 5-6 people in separate spaces throughout the church to begin an activity to focus on our core values as a church. These groups will invite discussions about those values that are of greatest importance to us as a community of faith and be our first step in coming to a consensus around these values.

It is hoped that it might be feasible to provide a lunch for this time, though that is uncertain at this time. If not, we will end our gathering at noon.

Your participation in this effort will bring enthusiasm and clarity to our church's effort to secure pastoral leadership to lead us into the future God has in store for us.

Beginning this Sunday there will be sign-up sheets in the fellowship hall for those who will participate. This will help us ensure that there is/are enough settings in which small groups can meet. Please make your plans now to attend and sign up.

In-Person Worship Continues

Though the infection rates in Michigan, and locally in Saginaw County are relatively high when compared with many other in the nation, the session believes that due to the high rate of vaccination among our members, that we will continue offering in-person worship on Sundays. Please continue to follow these protocols to insure that safety our members and community.

- 1. The sanctuary will be filled on a first come, first served basis, as household groups.
- 2. Please come in and exit through the center doors. The doors on the East side of the building will be locked.
- 3. <u>Masks are required.</u> They are an essential element in keeping one another safe, especially in indoor spaces with limited air movement.
- 4. Participants will be screened prior to admittance. Questions will be asked concerning his or her present state of health and possible exposure to the virus through others in the last 14 days.
- 5. You will be asked to use the hand sanitizer on both your way in and your way out.
- 6. Participation will be recorded that we might, if needed, provide contact tracing.
- 7. Sit in designated seating in your household groups. There is flexible seating and you are asked to use the noodles found in the pews to maintain a safe distance.
- 8. The pastor will not be wearing a mask while speaking. He will be behind a Plexiglas shield to protect worshippers.
- 9. There will be no Children's Time during the service or Sunday School after the Children's Time.
- 10. Those who would prefer to sit in the fellowship hall are welcomed to do so, and chairs will be provided that are socially distant. Family groups are welcomed to move them so that they can sit together.
- 11. There is a basket at the back of the church for your offering.
- 12. On the first Sunday of the month a bucket for our 2 cents a meal offering will be available. Please place your coins in either an envelope or a plastic bag.
- 13. You are to remain seated until after the completion of the Postlude. Please honor this so as not to create an issue with the livestreaming of our service.
- 14. Upon dismissal please do not stop to socialize, but move directly and quietly outside.
- 15. You are welcomed to socialize for as long as you would like outside. Bring a lawn chair if you would like to stay for a longer visit.
- 16. The service starts at 10:30. Please come early to give yourself time to go through the screening and seating processes.

We ask that you continue to be in prayer for the volunteers who provide assistance for our services, as well as for new volunteers to step up for these positions. If you have an interest in serving in the ministry of the gospel as a camera person, a computer assistant, or a worship planner working with media, please contact the pastor so that you can review the job description and the responsibilities of these positions.

Warren Ave Presbyterian Property

On Tuesday, May 25th, the Presbytery of Lake Huron called a special meeting to accept a proposal for the Warren Ave. property.

As part of that agreement, the presbytery would gift that property to the Holy Communion Gospel Center (HCGC), along with a total of \$100,000 in two payments.

The motion was tabled until the next presbytery meeting, June 8th, as the HCGC requested more money as the property will require of \$300,000 of repairs and improvements to remain a functioning building.

As the building's demolition would cost approximately \$150,000, and that it is the presbytery's desire that this building would continue to be a resource of support and compassion to its community, the presbytery may consider increasing the amount of money gifted and present a new proposal at the meeting on June 8th.

Linda Kennan, Presbytery Committee on Ministry liaison for Countryside Trinity Church, presented "Partnership, Polity, and Process" which described steps that needed to be taken in the process of a search for a new pastor.

Treasurer's Report: Mari presented the April finance report. Motion sustained to recommend to Stewardship & Finance Committee to research the investment of the money market funds.

Clerk's Report: Membership is 120.

Correspondence: Letter sent to the Nanum Presbyterian Church requesting the transfer of membership of Chong & Tom Ladner. Motion sustained to accept them into church membership by letter of transfer when the way be clear.

Letter received from Roger Scovill that he had reviewed the financial records of 2020 and found that "the accounting and administrative procedures result in accurate, timely and informative monthly financial statements."

Called Presbytery Meeting: Roger will be attending called meeting on May 25th during which the Presbytery trustees will recommend the sale of the Warren Avenue Church property to the Holy Communion Gospel Center. Presbytery is the owner of the church property.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Finance & Stewardship: R. Scovill reported that the deficit for April was about \$2500 for contributions.

Christian Outreach: K. Blehm related that May mission is Habitat for Humanity and June mission will be East Side Soup Kitchen. Baby shower donations were clothes and necessities plus \$325.00. Contributions for One Great Hour of Sharing were \$370.00.

Spiritual Life: D. Woodke made motion to authorize a gathering on church grounds on May 23 as part of the celebration of Pentecost and to celebrate graduation Sunday, June 13th in the same manner with the serving of cookies and beverages following safety protocols. Motion sustained. Chairs will be provided.

Return to Worship: Parker provided most recent updates from CDC and COVID infection sites for Michigan and Saginaw County. Decision to maintain our safety protocols that we are following at this time was made to provide for the safety and welfare of our members/friends. The precautions in place are as follows:

- ❖ We will continue to track, (for exposure purposes), all, people entering our building, whether it is for worship, meetings, or visitation.
- ❖ We will not take temperatures UNLESS the people coming into the building have not been here since the church reopened in March, ONLY THEN, will temperatures be taken and recorded, the symptom questions asked, and questions regarding exposure and vaccination status be asked and recorded.
- We will check on exposure to COVID whether they have been vaccinated or not.
- ❖ We will still ask that masks be worn unless it is an outdoor gathering.
- ❖ We would prefer that social distancing be practiced indoors.
- We will ask also that people continue to use hand sanitizer before and after leaving the building.
- ❖ Those coming into the building on a regular basis during the week, as staff, only need to sign in.

New Business: Mission Study Team will host congregational gatherings to examine and to develop core values and a vision statement for Countryside Trinity. This statement is a requirement of our mission study which is needed before we can look for a new pastor.

COVID 19 SAFETY PROTOCOL FOR CTC A note from your Session/Council

Safety protocols have changed markedly fast in the last week or so. Session met Tuesday, May 18, 2021 and reviewed recent data from CDC, the state of Michigan and Saginaw County. Saginaw County is still considered in the red zone with 29 COVID cases per 100,000 people and in a high vulnerability state. Michigan is also still at high rate for infection although infection rates are dropping. The rates are changing daily as more people become vaccinated. With these statistics in mind and with the need to provide for the safety and welfare for those entering our building, session members have agreed on the following safety precautions:

We are all anxious to be able to touch and to hug, but we still need to be cautious until we are sure that this life-changing virus no longer poses a threat to our lives and the lives of our loved ones. A huge THANK YOU to everyone who has showered my granddaughters, Aubree and Ainslee Mahan, with cards, gifts, donations and concern during this past ten days or so. If you are not aware, both girls were involved in a house/grease fire in the early morning hours of Monday, May 17th. Aubree received severe burns to her right arm and hand and down both legs from her thighs to her toes. She has been hospitalized at Hurley Medical Center in Flint since approximately 3:30 a.m. on the 17th. During this time she has undergone several debridement surgeries where they literally scrape the skin off her legs in an effort to get down to healthy skin. As you can imagine this has been extremely painful for her. We did receive good news on the 25th that while they took her down to surgery to begin skin grafting - when they got her bandages off (only a day and a half after they looked previously) there were miraculous signs of healing beginning in those areas. We believe this is a sign of God's answer to all of yours and our many prayers over the last week. So, as of right now, they are hoping that skin grafts will not be required. Allelulia!!! We still do not have a release date from the hospital, but even when that happens, she will need to make weekly trips back to Flint for treatment for months to come. Right now they are predicting it will be 3-4 months before she will be able to return to work. While Ainslee didn't receive any burns - she too has been suffering from anxiety, depression and concern for her twin. Please keep my girls in your prayers during this next few months.
