YOUR SESSION/COUNCIL AT WORK, MAY 15, 2022 MARY ANN PARKER, CLERK OF SESSION

Following prayer by Pastor Jane Lynn Young reports were received.

Minutes of the last month's stated session meeting approved.

Clerk's Report: Church membership remains at 113.

Communion was served to 33 parishioners on May 1, 2022. Teams served communion to 12 homebound members plus 2 family members.

Treasurer's Report: Report for April approved.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Jane introduced Rhonda Otway. Following questions by session members of Rhonda, a motion was sustained to receive Rhonda into church membership on Reaffirmation of Faith.

Denominational Report: Scovill volunteered to serve as Elder Commissioner to the June 7th Presbytery meeting at Alma College.

PNC Report: PNC continues to review pastor information forms of pastors who may be interested in serving our church.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Building & Grounds: Scovill reported that he had a scheduled appointment with Orkin representative regarding the ant problem in the church offices.

Finance & Stewardship: Scovill reported that the third stewardship letter should be going out soon.

Debit card policy was approved by the session. Parker talked with McKenzie, church treasurer, regarding the ZOOM account. The fee for the ZOOM account will be paid from the technology account instead of the PNC account as previously decided.

Spiritual Life: D. Davis reported that the monitor for the back of the church will soon be installed. Monitor and equipment for installation totaled \$764.19.

Personnel: Parker reported that the job descriptions for the paid staff have been amended and are waiting for committee review. Personnel policy handbook is now being reviewed. Loviska, administrative assistant, will be taking vacation July 12, 13, and 14. Coverage discussed.

NEW BUSINESS: Redfield will work on finding a third person to represent congregation-at-large on the Nominating Committee. We will then call a congregational meeting to approve that member to fill the vacancy.

Meeting adjourned with prayer.

As the war in Ukraine continues to escalate – the Christian Outreach Committee at Countryside Trinity Church is searching for ways we can help.


