YOUR SESSION AT WORK

NOVEMBER 20, 2022

MARY ANN PARKER, CLERK OF SESSION

Following prayer by Pastor and Moderator, Jane Lynn Young committee reports given.

Minutes of last month's stated session meeting approved.

Treasurer's report received.

Clerk's Report: Church membership is 114. Communion served on November 6, 2022. Parker reported that the Session minute book and church register were approved without exceptions by Presbytery 10/24/2022.

Motion sustained to ask members to pay \$30.00/member to cover per capita for both Presbytery and UCC for 2023. **Motion sustained** to contribute \$250.00 to the Wider Church Mission of PCUSA and \$250.00 to UCC Mission.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Jane is working on material for the Advent study.

Denominational Report: Roger Scovill will serve as elder commissioner at Presbytery meeting on 12/6/2022.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Christian Outreach: Blehm reported that the November missions are Hidden Harvest, Thanksgiving Food Gift cards to eight families from Weiss Elementary School, and The Shoe Box Saginaw Project.

Motion sustained to remove 14 members who have not attended CTC or contributed in any way to the life of the church in several years from the membership list. These people had received letters regarding their membership status and did not reply asking to stay on the rolls by October 31, 2022, as requested in the letter they received,

Finance & Stewardship: Mari McKenzie, church treasurer, presented the budget for 2023 which Session approved. **Motion sustained** to change software to digitalize congregation contributions and financial records to PowerChurch no later than December 1, 2022. We will not be using QuickBooks any longer which has gone up in cost. This switch will save the church about \$1,100/year.

Personnel: Parker reported that twelve people participated in the BLS/AED lifesaving courses presented by non-member Brian Leach (Avis's son). We will be showing our appreciation to Brian and his son, Travis (a senior at Swan Valley) who assisted with the classes. Action taken regarding Christmas gifts for the staff and the pastor.

Spiritual Life: Communion dates for 2023 were approved. Woodke related that an “Unspoken Prayer Table with Candles” will be instituted. This will be similar to the lighting of the candles that we celebrated on All Saints’ Day.

Nominating Committee: Redfield reported that the committee members are working on the slate of officers for 2023.

Adjournment: Meeting adjourned with prayer by M. Parker at 1:15 PM.

This is the Menu button. After you click on it, a menu will drop down.

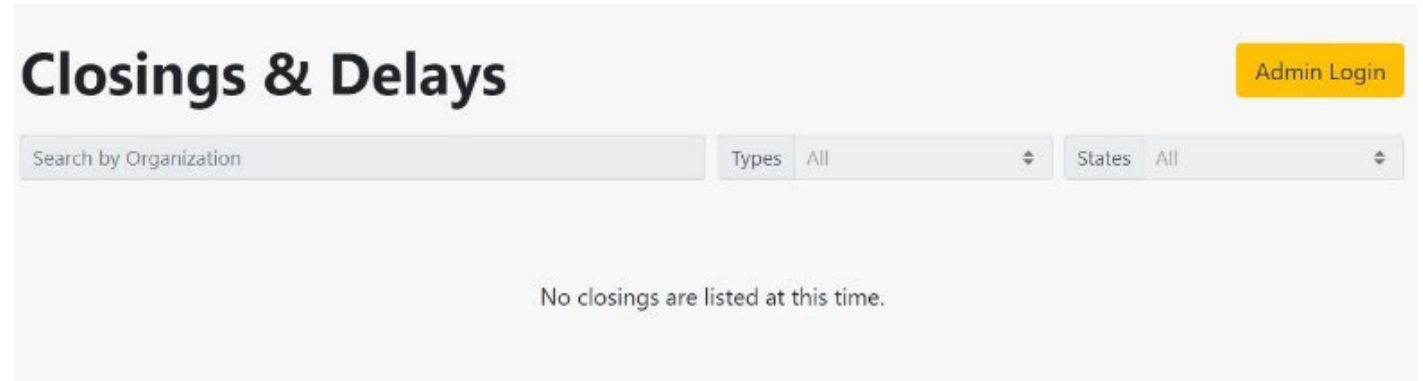
Then click on the arrow to the right of where it says, "First Alert Weather", see below be sure to click on the arrow to the right side:
